What Practice Makes Sense for People with Cognitive Challenges

Dates: September 17 and 18, 2010

Workshop Description and Objectives: The workshop will explore the current understanding of cognitive problems in the areas of neglect/inattention apraxia, awareness, memory, non-spatial attention and executive functioning following neurological damage and the impact on occupational performance. Current best practices in assessment and intervention (with an emphasis on the latter) for each will be discussed or demonstrated. The opportunity to apply this learning to treatment approaches for two clients will be given. This course will provide an opportunity for discussion and reflection throughout. Stroke and acquired brain injury populations will be emphasized.

Presenter: Debbie Hebert is the corporate practice leader and clinical educator for occupational therapy at the Toronto Rehabilitation Institute. She has worked for almost 30 years in the area of adult neurorehabilitation. She teaches interprofessional teams, consults with therapists and patients, and is an Associate Professor with the Department of Occupational Science and Occupational Therapy at the University of Toronto.

Her research interests include intervention for persons with perceptual and cognitive impairment with special interest in inattention and apraxia, participation after acquired brain injury and stroke, and knowledge translation.
